David Gomez is a current undergraduate student at Georgetown University where he is majoring in Culture and Politics and minoring in Japanese. Originally from South Central Los Angeles, David attended Animo Jackie Robinson Charter High School and was accepted into the GCI Fellowship 2016. In the same year, he was awarded the GSP Seed Funding Competition Award to develop portable shower systems supporting the homeless community in Los Angeles.

During his first year at Georgetown, David interned with the Restaurant Opportunities Center of DC (ROC-DC), a social justice organization dedicated to uplifting immigrant workers in the service industry. While at ROC-DC, he worked closely with members of the service industry to increase the hourly minimum wage for tipped workers from \$2.13 to \$13.25. Later that year, David accepted a Fulbright Summer Institute Scholarship to study the ongoing efforts of racial justice, migration, and environmental sustainability in Bristol, England. During his time in Bristol, David conducted surveys and created a proposal plan to address the modern-day remnants of slaveholder statues.

In his sophomore year, David interned with Many Languages One Voice, a non-profit organization dedicated to helping the immigrant community in D.C. Throughout the course of his internship, David directed a pro-bono legal clinic representing low-income workers in workplace violation cases.
